Lastly, my best wishes to all the FMS KL& Putrajaya. Stay safe!



We proudly present our star of the year, Dr Rozita binti Zakaria, FMS from KK Putrajaya Presint 18 who is the Head of Family Medicine Service of 2019 - 2021.



She was in the first batch of FMS graduates from UKM when the university introduced the field of speciality in Malaysia in 1997. Klinik Kesihatan Pasir Gudang was given the honour to receive her service as FMS from 1997 until 2015. She pursued her subspecialty in Child Health in 2007 from University of Warwick, United Kingdom with a year of clinical experience in National Health Services, Coventry, West Midlands. For 19 years under her excellence governance, the clinic has established "Pemulihan Dalam Klinik (PDK)' for children with special needs, Pediatrics Palliative Care unit and Childhood Obesity Service.

She was then transferred to Kesihatan Sultan Ismail. Johor Bahru to continue her great contributions in area of scientific research by leading an Industry Sponsored Research (ISR) in Acute Childhood Diarrhoea well as as Investigator Initiated Research (IIR) in Under 5 mortality in Malaysia in the same year (2015). Her passion in scientific research has made her successfully conduct more than 20 studies with 7 publications at international and national level within 6 years (2015-2020)





STAR OF THE YEAR

Apart from scientific research, she is actively involved in various TWG in creating new Guidelines and CPGs for the benefit of all health practitioners to practise the latest Evidence-based Medicine. Among her excellent work includes Guidelines on Covid-19 Management in Malaysia, Training Module on Early detection of common cancers and referral pathways, Hepatitis C Training Module for Primary Care in Malaysia and Pain free programme and Pain as 5th vital sign Programme.







Her peak of career was when she was appointed as the Head of Family Medicine Service in the Ministry of Health and has since further brought up the family medicine fraternity to a higher level including appointment of JUSA C Grade to FMS - Dr Baizury Bashah was the first FMS to receive such recognition. Apart from her great contributions in clinical, administrative and research, she was heavily involved in education for the FMS career pathway. The work has brought her to Dublin as delegates representing The Ministry of Health in the effort to establish a training program through Parallel Pathway for family Medicine. From that, Malaysia-Ireland Training Programme for Family Medicine (MInTFM) was introduced in Malaysia in 2019 with the first batch of FMS due to graduate in 2022.



She had been honoured with "Anugerah Perkhidmatan Cemerlang" twice throughout her career in 1999 and 2009. Her great contributions for the country know no boundaries as she actively involved in voluntary and humanitarian work with Muslim Volunteer Malaysia (MVM), and is currently an active donor for Majlis Kanser Nasional (MKN).


TEAM BUILDING FMS KL & PUTRAJAYA

33 delegates visited Maternal & Child Health unit in Klinik Kesihatan Cheras on 26th October 2022.



Briefing on HIV and syphilis rapid diagnostic test kits and HIV pre-test counselling aid by a flip chart in the blood taking room.

The list of topics included were 1)HIV & Syphilis screening, treatment and care for pregnant mothers, 2)Diagnostic testing, treatment and care for exposed infants, 3)Immunization and infant feeding practices for exposed infants,

4)Post-delivery home visits, 5)Family planning for women living with HIV and 6)the role of NGO to the mother living with HIV.

A guided tour which mimicked patient flow in Cheras Maternal & Child Health Clinic was then conducted to further enhance the sharing experience on EMTCT services in Malaysia.

During the tour, the delegates were brought to various counters such as the registration counter, consultation room, phlebotomy room, laboratory, and pharmacy to gain first-hand experience on the workflow of our existing EMTCT services.

The fruitful and enriching experience sharing session ended with a group photo shoot and memento presentation.

Klinik Kesihatan Putrajaya P18 received a visit by delegation of ASEAN Emergency Operation Centre (EOC) Network from Cambodia, Laos and Thailand on 6th October 2022. The delegation was led by Dr. Pasakorn Akarasewi from Thailand. The main aim of the visit was to see the management of outbreak in primary care setting. This visit gave the delegation some ideas on how our country manages outbreak cases especially COVID-19 in health clinics.











ANTENATAL CLASS









Maternal Child Health Unit (MCH) KKKL had conducted a 2 weekly series of antenatal classes since January 2022. A total of 23 sessions had been done with participation of 253 mothers. This was a multidisciplinary approach where the knowledge from various teams were shared in one seating. The aim was to create awareness and to give the correct information on pregnancy related problems, delivery process, postnatal care and neonatal care.







FALL CLINIC

The objective of the clinic is to prevent fall among elderly, therefore reducing risk of injury by specifically identifying risk factors of fall and conducting a holistic assessment. The clinic runs once a week with an expected attendance of 25 patients per month. The target population consists of older people with an increased risk of falls or osteoporosis patients requiring treatment.

It is a multidisciplinary approach where the each team will meet at the end of the clinic sessions to discuss further on the management of the patients.

PRO TEEN GEN Z

ProTeen Gen Z programme was held twice on 26th March and 6th August 2022 by PKMR (Perkhidmatan Kesihatan Mesra Remaja) team KK Kuala Lumpur, in collaboration with primer team PK Titiwangsa and Non-Communicable Diseases Unit. It also collaborated with Unit Pendidikan Kesihatan (UPK), Unit Rehabilitasi, Unit Sains Pemakanan, Unit HIV/STI, Unit Kerja Sosial Perubatan, Majlis Kanser Nasional (MAKNA) and Agensi Antidadah Kebangsaan (AADK) Wilayah Persekutuan.

The aim of this program was to create awareness and gave health education on risk reduction activities among teenagers.











WARGA EMAS PROGRAM









The 'Warga Emas Sihat & Aktif' programme was aimed to share health information with the elderly in PPR Air Panas using various activities. The session was made interesting whereby information were relayed through games like wheel of fortune, throwing darts, playing traditional games like congkak and guessing the juice.








'KUMPULAN BERLIAN' PROGRAMME

Through these programmes, both medical staffs and public can gain knowledge about TB and increase their awareness.

The activities conducted include talks on diabetes, exercise regime for diabetes, insulin technique, foot care and dietary advice.




















HARI RAYA AIDILFITRI **CELEBRATION**

Approaches to management of rhabdomyolysis as the adverse effect of a drug interaction between atorvastatin and sacubitril/valsartan: a case report

Case summary

A 58-year-old male with coronary heart disease and chronic HF treated with the optimal dose of atorvastatin and other cardiovascular medications was frequently admitted for acute decompensation of HF. We decided to optimize his condition by adding sacubitril/valsartan to his treatment regime. He presented to our outpatient clinic with worsening myalgia and oliguria 6 days later. He was readmitted with markedly elevated serum creatinine kinase (CK) (94850 U/L; normal range 32–294 U/L), deranged liver function tests, and acute kidney injury. We withheld atorvastatin and sacubitril/valsartan and treated him with renal replacement therapy.

CASE REPORT

- Admitted in Hospital A, vital signs and physical examination unremarkable
- Lungs were clear on examination; no imaging was done
- Treated asmeningitis: Started on IV Ceftriaxone 1g12h
- Persistent fever with new cough and thrombocytopenia
- Referred to ID physician in Hospital B
- She gradually developed:
 - o hepatosplenomegaly, multiple lymphadenopathies, liver failure, generalised oedema. renal failure, bilateral pleural effusion with collapse (consolidation of right lower lobe), severe sepsis and metabolic acidosis
- Throughout her admission she was treated with multiple drug regimens & a trial of




FIGURE 2.1: **Bone Marrow** Aspirate slides showing increase in lympocytosis& haemophagocytic activity




FIGURE 2.3: Trephine Biopsy with hypercellular bone marrow with diffuse infiltration of abnormal lymphoid cells




FIGURE 4: Summary of Investigations & Management throughout Hospital

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CAREER PATHWAY POSTGRADUATE PROGRAMMES



Primary care (also known as Family Medicine in Malaysia), is the first point of contact that a patient has with healthcare system. Primary care practice is guided by principles of the discipline. This comprises of care that is primary contact, personalized, patient centered, preventive, comprehensive, continuous, coordinated and community based. (Allen et al 2011). There were only 924 Family Medicine Specialist (FMS) in the country, including 625 currently serving in 397 health clinics of the Ministry of Health (MOH) as of December 2021. Currently, the Ministry Of Health is targeting at least one FMS person every 1,060 MOH health nationwide. We hope that this fraternity will continue to grow and more medical officers choose this specialty.

There are three main pathways for Postgraduate training in Primary Care Medicine:

THE UNIVERSITIES' MASTERS PROGRAMME

This is a 4-year (to 7 years maximum) programme in which trainees are registered to one of the six universities in the Conjoint Board of Family Medicine namely, University of Malaya, Universiti Kebangsaan Malaysia, Universiti Sains Malaysia, Universiti Putra Malaysia, Universiti Teknologi MARA and Universiti Islam Antarabangsa. It is divided into hospital rotations and clinic postings. The rotations cover 22 clinical blocks, followed by clinic postings where the trainee is trained in the skills relevant to Primary Care. This is followed by a period of shadowing a Family Medicine Specialist.

THE ACADEMY OF FAMILY PHYSICIAN MALAYSIA (AFPM) FAMILY MEDICINE TRAINING PROGRAMME

It is a 4-year programme. It is run by the Academy of Family Physicians of Malaysia and divided into the Graduate Certificate in Family Medicine, (2 years duration), followed by the Advanced Training in Family Medicine which is another 2 years.

THE MALAYSIA-IRELAND TRAINING PROGRAMME FOR FAMILY MEDICINE (MINTFM)

It is a four-year programme and is run by the Irish College of General Practitioners (ICGP), in collaboration with iHEED Health Training Limited (iheed). The RCSI & UCD Malaysia Campus (RUMC); previously known as Penang Medical College and MOH Malaysia (KKM) help to manage this program in Malaysia. It is divided into hospital rotations (2 years duration) and clinic postings which is another 2 years.

Candidates are required to meet certain essential entry requirements for the training programme. Below are the summary of these requirements. Full descriptions can be found in Primary Care Medicine Postgraduate Training in Malaysia (Guide for Applicants) Version 1, 2020 and https://www.rcsiucd.edu.my/programmes/mintfm/.

Assessment is an essential part of training and reflects the clinical and non-clinical activities that the trainee will perform as a Primary Care specialist. These include clinical activities relating to the care of individual patients, behavioral and communication aspects, and non-clinical activities relating to administrative and organizational tasks, and academic skills. Trainees will be assessed regularly throughout the duration of the programme using both formative and summative tools.


