Primary care has been put as the main component in many countries around the world. It is believed if health system in a country focus on primary care, the cost of health expenditure would rather less. Primary health care is a concept elaborated in the 1978 Declaration of Alma-Ata during an International Conference of Primary Care in Soviet Union. It is based on the principles of equity, participation, intersectoral action, appropriate technology and a central role played by the health system. The declaration was the first international commitment underlining the portance of primary health care. Since then, the primary care approach has been accepted by member countries of the World Health Organization (WHO) as the key to achieving the goal of "Health for all'. A year later, Selective Primary Health Care (SPHC) was introduced in Italy to clearly specify strategies and targets towards common causes of death at low cost.

Primary care practices provide health promotion, disease prevention, health maintenance, counselling, patient education, diagnosis and treatment of acute and chronic illnesses in a variety of health care settings. It provides

tomb and coordinates with other specialists or services that the patient may need. It is a central discipline of medicine around which medical and allied health disciplines are arranged to form a cooperative team for the benefit of the individual, the family and the community. The services are unique as it can meet the needs of patients with undifferentiated problems. In general, the vast majority of patients' concern and need can be met in the primary care practice itself. It is located in the community hence facilitating access to health care.

FMSA hopes more emphasis is given for primary care especially in terms of equipments, medications, human resource, career opportunity, recognition and governance in order to ensure more can be done by specialists at primary care level for the nation.
